Delhi Mumbai Expressway DND Jaipur Stretch To Be Ready By June 2026

The central government has shared a fresh update on the Delhi-Mumbai Expressway, one of India's largest highway projects. The first Delhi section, running from DND Flyway to Jaitpur, is expected to be completed by June 2026. This information was given in the Lok Sabha during a written response on Thursday.

The update brings clarity for commuters in Delhi and nearby regions who are waiting for smoother and faster road connectivity towards Faridabad and beyond.

Progress Status of the DND Faridabad Sohna Link

The DND Faridabad Sohna stretch is around 59 kilometres long and is being developed in three separate construction parts. According to the government, two of these sections are already complete and open for public use.

The remaining portion is the nine-kilometre stretch between DND Junction and Jaitpur. This part is close to completion, with over 94 per cent of the physical work already done.

Reason Behind the Delay in the Delhi Section

The road transport ministry explained that the delay in finishing the DND to Jaitpur section happened due to approval issues. The drawings needed for a structure crossing the Agra Canal required clearance from the Uttar Pradesh Irrigation Department. This approval process took longer than expected, slowing down construction.

With approvals now in place, the work is moving towards final completion.

Total Spending on the Delhi-Mumbai Expressway

The Delhi-Mumbai Expressway is a massive national project, both in scale and cost. The government confirmed that over Rs 71,700 crore has already been spent on the expressway so far. This amount covers construction across all states the corridor passes through.

Key Features of the Delhi-Mumbai Expressway

The Delhi-Mumbai Expressway is being built as an eight-lane access-controlled highway. It is designed for a maximum speed of 120 kilometres per hour. There is also space planned for future widening to 12 lanes if traffic demand increases.

Once fully operational, the expressway will connect Delhi to Mumbai through Haryana, Rajasthan, Madhya Pradesh, Gujarat, and Maharashtra. The project aims to reduce travel time, improve road safety, and support faster movement of goods and people.

Why the DND Jaitpur Stretch Matters

The DND Jaitpur section is important because it acts as a key entry and exit point for Delhi. Its completion will improve traffic flow towards Faridabad and southern Haryana, while also easing congestion on existing city roads.

The expected June 2026 deadline now gives commuters and planners a clear timeline to look forward to.
